

All: I confess to almighty God,





Since he clings to me in love, I will **free** him; protect him *for he* **knows** my name.


When he calls I shall answer: 'I am **with** you,' I will save him in distress and *give him* **glo**ry.

With length of life I will con**tent** him; I shall let him see my *saving* **pow**er.




